

# PRESCRIPTION DRUG PLAN FORMULARY, PHARMACY NETWORK, AND PRICING INFORMATION PUBLIC USE FILE METHODOLOGY

## Overview:

This Quarterly Public Use File (SPUF) is comprised of 10 separate files. Each file is flat (ASCII) with pipe (|) delimiters and a header record that contains the field name. Sample files are included for the larger files so that users can examine the fields before processing.

The SPUF is built from data included in the first new posting during the last month for a given quarter on the Medicare Plan Finder (MPF) tool available at <https://www.medicare.gov/>. Pharmacy network and drug pricing data are updated on the MPF tool every two weeks, thus the data in this SPUF may not match exactly what currently appears on the MPF tool. Each SPUF has a naming convention of SPUF.YYYY.YYYYMMDD.zip. The first four digits of the zip file's name corresponds to the contract year (CY) of the data included in the SPUF. The final eight digits correspond to the date posted to the CMS website.

Three types of Part D plans appear in the PUF. "Local Medicare Advantage" plans are identified by a CONTRACT\_ID that begins with the letter H. "Regional Medicare Advantage" plans are identified by a CONTRACT\_ID that begins with the letter R. Stand-alone "Prescription Drug Plans" are identified by a CONTRACT\_ID that begins with the letter S. Each plan is uniquely identified by the combination of CONTRACT\_ID, PLAN\_ID, and SEGMENT\_ID (note that SEGMENT\_ID is always zero for R and S contracts). The following Plans are not included in this Public Use File:

- Non-Part D Plans
- National PACE Plans
- Employer Sponsored Plans
- Demonstration Plans (MMPs are included)

Plans whose data has been suppressed in the PUF reporting period due to plan request, data inaccuracy, or other issues identified by CMS appear in the Plan Information file with the PLAN\_SUPPRESSED\_YN field set to "Y". They do not appear in any other files.

Effective January 1, 2011, the Medicare Coverage Gap Discount Program will make manufacturer discounts available to eligible Medicare beneficiaries receiving applicable, covered Part D drugs, while in the coverage gap. In order to participate in the Medicare Coverage Gap Discount Program, manufacturers must sign an agreement with CMS to provide the discount on all of its applicable drugs (i.e. prescription drugs approved or licensed under new drug applications or biologic license applications). Beginning in 2011, only those applicable drugs that are covered under a signed manufacturer agreement with CMS will be covered under Part D. This file does not reflect discounts applied to these drugs. The Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 sunsets the Medicare Coverage Gap Discount Program effective January 1, 2025.

The SPUF contains the following files:

1. Plan Information File - Includes information for each plan (name, contract ID, plan ID, service area, etc.).

2. Geographic Locator File - Includes the Medicare Advantage (MA) and Prescription Drug Plan (PDP) Region codes and county codes.
3. Basic Drugs Formulary File - Includes formulary details for each plan including National Drug Codes (NDCs), Tier Level, and indicators for Step Therapy, Quantity Limits, and Prior Authorization.
4. Excluded Drugs Formulary File - Enhanced alternative plans may elect to provide a supplemental benefit and cover excluded drugs. File includes formulary details for excluded drugs that are covered by the plan (for enhanced alternative plans only).
5. Beneficiary Cost File - Plan level cost sharing details for preferred, non-preferred and mail order network pharmacies.
6. Pharmacy Network File - National Provider Identifier (NPI) numbers for each network pharmacy including preferred, retail, and mail order indicators.
7. Pricing File - Plan level average monthly unit costs for formulary Part D drugs.
8. Partial Gap Coverage File - Plan-RxCUI combinations that are on tiers that offer gap coverage for some drugs on the tier.
9. Indication Based Coverage Formulary File - Includes drugs covered based on FDA-approved indication for each plan.
10. Insulin Beneficiary Cost File - Plan level cost sharing details for insulin at preferred, non-preferred and mail order network pharmacies.
